### Vernal Equinox

Everyone is eager to get back to warm weather, so find out when spring starts—and enjoy vernal equinox facts and folklore.

Specifically, the Northern Hemisphere marks the spring equinox on Monday, March 20, 2017, at exactly 6:29 A.M. EDT.

#### WHEN DOES SPRING BEGIN?

- Astronomically speaking, the equinox (March 19 or 20 every year) marks spring's beginning in the Northern Hemisphere (whereas it announces fall's arrival in the Southern Hemisphere). The equinox happens at the same moment worldwide, even if our clock times reflect a different time zone.
- Meteorologically speaking, in the Northern Hemisphere, the official spring season always begins on March 1 and continues through May 31. Summer begins on June 1; autumn, September 1; and winter, December 1. Weather scientists divide the year into quarters this way to make it easier to compare seasonal and monthly statistics from one year to the next. The meteorological seasons are based on annual temperature cycles rather than on the position of Earth in relation to the Sun, and they more closely follow the Gregorian calendar. Using the dates of the astronomical equinoxes and solstices for the seasons would present a statistical problem because these dates can vary slightly each year.

### **Luminar: The only photo-editing tool most Mac users need**

*Mac users seeking a powerful photo-editing tool that's capable of transforming average images should try Macphun's bargain-priced Luminar.*

When it comes to photo editing, users should be careful what they wish for. Creating striking images can quickly become a complex task that requires mastering difficult image-manipulation programs, and understanding layers, filters, and numerous other components, as well as appreciating how those elements impact and depend upon one another. Fortunately, photo-editing applications simplify the process and make it easier to create compelling images.

Macphun's Luminar photo-editing program has an adaptive contextual interface, and users can quickly apply presets, tweak colors, add filters, crop images, make simple lighting and shadow adjustments, and complete other frequently performed actions. Powerful filter treatments can be performed within 10 or 20 seconds. Users who want to accommodate specific looks and treatments, and test and adjust numerous other options can do so, thereby significantly customizing photos using advanced settings.

For example, load a photo within Luminar, and you'll find a variety of filters listed at the bottom of the screen. Selecting a filter applies the preset, and the main window immediately displays the results of applying that preset. Change your mind? No worries, just click the Undo icon. Or, you can pick from several other filter categories, each of which possesses its own unique presets.

Mac users seeking to dig deeper and customize settings have two immediate options—Luminar presents adaptive tools within the right contextual menu.

For example, applying the Travel preset's Impressive filter to an image results in four filters appearing. Scrolling down through these filter settings enables adjusting 14 slider bars that change tone, color contrast, polarization, and highlights and shadows. Selecting an alternative preset, such as the Basic Vivid filter, updates the right contextual menu to enable adjusting 11 slider bars in four categories: Tone, Saturation/Vibrance, Polarizing Filter, and Clarity.

Photos and images can be saved as Luminar files, which receive a .lmnr file extension. Photos and images can be exported as JPEG, PNG, GIF, TIFF, JPEG-2000, Photoshop, and PDF files.

With support for RAW images, direct plug-in integration with Apple Aperture, Adobe Lightroom, and Adobe Photoshop, an Apple Photos extension, non-destructive editing, numerous preset filters, color toning, masking, and layers support, Luminar offers a compelling bargain for \$69. The program also includes black-and-white and bulk processing capabilities, as well as object removal features.

Even though Luminar has limited options compared to competitors such as Photoshop, it's easy to see how Macphun's app might replace many Mac users' need for any other photo- and image-editing tool.

## Hints/Tips

### **How to type accent marks on iPhone and iPad keyboards**

*Using accent marks, iOS users can more easily type in different languages. Here's how.*

These days, a lot of important communication is conducted on our phones. That means we often can't get away with simple replies anymore, and may need to type complicated sentences, or words in another language.

For iOS users, accent marks make it easy for you to type in languages like Spanish or French. And, these alternative characters are pretty easy to find...if you know where to look. To start, unlock your iPhone or iPad, and open any application that utilizes the keyboard.

Once you have a keyboard-enabled application open, find the letter you want to accent. To add an accent (or to choose an alternate version of that letter), place your finger on the key and leave it there until a popup appears with all of the alternate options for that letter. For this example, we'll look at the letter "E."

Once the popup appears, simply slide your finger onto the alternate form of the letter you want, and release it. The selected accent will be highlighted in blue. Currently the letters A, E, I, O, U, Y, C, L, N, S, and Z have available accents.

Alternative characters aren't just available for letters—they work with certain symbols and emoji as well. For example, place your finger on the "\$" to get different symbols for other forms of currency. Symbols like the percent symbol and many others can also be changed. Additionally, the skin tone on emoji like the high five or thumbs up symbol can also be changed using this method.

It's important to note that, if you're using a device with 3D Touch, like the iPhone 6 or later, or if you're using the iPad Pro with its pressure-sensitive display, you want to touch the text very lightly. If you have one of these devices, and put too much pressure on the letter, it will engage a different functionality.

While typing, if an iOS user with 3D Touch or an iPad Pro puts too much pressure on the keyboard, the keys will all turn grey, and the user will be able to move their finger around to position the cursor wherever they would like in the body of the text they were writing. This is especially useful when crafting long business emails. If you have an older iPhone or iPad model without the aforementioned features, you will not be able to use the cursor feature.
